BEST PRACTICE FOR USING CHLOR TABS



Bleach is especially effective at killing germs, including Coronavirus. But for it to properly disinfect you need to following the instructions, such as making sure not to decant into spray bottles, diluting in the proper ratio and mixing a fresh solution immediately before you use it. Read our tips below:



1. Don't apply using spray bottles

We advise against pouring your solution into a spray bottle. Bleach can react with the metal parts of the trigger spray nozzle and cause rusting. This can reduce how effective your cleaner is. Trigger spray bottles also increase the risk of the product being inhaled, which can be very dangerous.

2. How should you apply bleach?

The best method is to make your solution in a bucket and apply with a cloth. Saturate the cloth in enough solution to allow the surface you're treating to remain visibly wet for the required contact time.



3. Make sure to follow dilution guidance

Food Surfaces & Equipment (Passes EN1276:2019): Add 1 tablet to 2 litres of clean tap water to provide a 500ppmm available chlorine solution. Soak or wipe & leave for 5 minutes. Rinse if required

Emergency Water Purification: 1 tablet per 100l or 1 per 50l where heavily contaminated.



4. Make your solution immeditely before use.

Best practice is to mix your solutions fresh, just before every application. This is because bleach is more unstable in its diluted form, which can reduce its effectiveness. Diluted bleach can degrade due to light, temperature, or contamination causing the active ingredient to breakdown. Therefore, it is especially important to mix fresh for disinfecting.
